NOTICE TO CEASE AND DESIST

Dear Mr. Belinsky:

Recently, the Iowa Board of Medicine (Board) reviewed information which indicates that you have publicly professed to be a physician or surgeon in violation of the laws and rules governing the practice of medicine in Iowa. The information reviewed by the Board indicates that you have not graduated from an accredited medical school and you do not hold an Iowa medical license.

Iowa Code Section 148.1 provides that the following persons are deemed to be engaged in the practice of medicine in Iowa:

1. Persons who publicly profess to be physicians or surgeons or who publicly profess to assume the duties incident to the practice of medicine or surgery.
2. Persons who prescribe, or prescribe and furnish medicine for human ailments or treat the same by surgery.
3. Persons who act as representatives of any person in doing any of the things mentioned in this section.


A person who is engaged in the practice of medicine pursuant to Iowa Code Section 148.1 is required to hold an active Iowa medical license. See Iowa Code Section 147.2. In the event a person engages in the practice of medicine (publicly professes to be a physician or surgeon) without an active Iowa medical license, the office of the Iowa Attorney General is authorized to file a civil action against that person in district court to obtain a permanent injunction prohibiting that person from engaging in the unauthorized practice of medicine. See Iowa Code Sections 147.83 and 147.92. Furthermore, such unlicensed practice could subject you to criminal charges. Iowa Code Section 147.103A(1) provides that violation of Iowa Code Section 147.2 is a Class "D" felony.

You are hereby ordered to **CEASE AND DESIST** from publicly professing to be a physician or surgeon in Iowa. If the Board receives information which indicates that you have publicly professed to be a physician or surgeon or to assume the duties incident to the practice of medicine or surgery in Iowa, after the date you receive this letter, a civil injunction action may be filed against you by the office of the Iowa Attorney General and the case may be referred to the county attorney for criminal prosecution.
