TERMINATION ORDER

Date: March 20, 2013.

1. On December 2, 2006, Respondent entered into a Consent Agreement with the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (Kansas Board). The Kansas Board concluded that Respondent violated the Kansas healing arts act when he failed to provide appropriate care and treatment to three patients in Overland Park, Kansas, between 1996 and 2003, including, but not limited to the following:

- A. Respondent failed to perform essential diagnostic testing and failed to see the patient prior to performing scheduled surgery, despite being notified of a change in the patient's condition, for a patient who presented to the emergency department following an automobile accident;
- B. Respondent failed to present to the hospital in a timely manner to evaluate a patient in an emergent clinical situation despite being paged several times by hospital staff; and

- C. Respondent failed to let Colloidion placed on a patient's incisions adequately dry before employing a cautery wand near the incision igniting vapors from the evaporating ether in the Colloidion.

Under the terms of the Kansas Consent Agreement, Respondent received a public censure, was assessed a \$5,000 civil fine and was required to successfully complete the ProBE Professional/Problem Based Ethics course on or before April 30, 2007.

2. On September 8, 2008, Respondent submitted an application for a permanent Iowa medical license.

3. On July 21, 2009, Respondent entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board and he was granted Iowa permanent medical license no. 38597, subject to the following terms and conditions.

- A. **PROHIBITION - LAPAROSCOPIC SURGERY:** Respondent is prohibited from performing laparoscopic surgery under his Iowa medical license.

4. Recently, Respondent submitted an application to terminate the prohibition from performing laparoscopic surgery under his Iowa medical license.

5. On March 8, 2013, the Board voted to terminate the prohibition from performing laparoscopic surgery under his Iowa medical license.

THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: that all restrictions placed on Respondent's Iowa medical license are terminated and Respondent's Iowa medical license is returned to its full privileges, free and clear of all restrictions.

This Order is effective on March 20, 2013.

CONSENT AGREEMENT

COME NOW the Iowa Board of Medicine (hereinafter “the Board”) and Charles Edward Stuckey, M.D. (hereinafter “Applicant”) on July 21, 2009, and hereby enter into the following Consent Agreement for the issuance of a permanent medical license under the following terms and conditions:

1. Applicant is hereby granted Iowa permanent license no. 38597 to practice medicine and surgery in Iowa.
2. Applicant submitted an application for a permanent Iowa medical license on September 8, 2008.
3. On December 2, 2006, Applicant entered into a Consent Agreement with the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (Kansas Board). The Kansas Board concluded that Applicant violated the Kansas healing arts act when he failed to provide appropriate care and treatment to three patients in Overland Park, Kansas, between 1996 and 2003, including, but not limited to the following:

- A. Applicant failed to perform essential diagnostic testing and failed to see the patient prior to performing scheduled surgery, despite being notified of a change in the patient's condition, for a patient who presented to the emergency department following an automobile accident;
- B. Applicant failed to present to the hospital in a timely manner to evaluate a patient in an emergent clinical situation despite being paged several times by hospital staff; and
- C. Applicant failed to let Colloidion placed on a patient's incisions adequately dry before employing a cautery wand near the incision igniting vapors from the evaporating ether in the Colloidion.

Under the terms of the Kansas Consent Agreement, Applicant received a public censure, was assessed a \$5,000 civil fine and was required to successfully complete the ProBE Professional/Problem Based Ethics course on or before April 30, 2007.

4. **PROHIBITION - LAPAROSCOPIC SURGERY:** Applicant is prohibited from performing laparoscopic surgery under his Iowa medical license.

5. **CITATION AND WARNING:** Applicant is hereby **CITED** for having disciplinary action taken against him by the Kansas Board when he failed to provide appropriate care and treatment to three patients. Applicant is hereby **WARNED** that such conduct in the state of Iowa may result in disciplinary action, including suspension or revocation of his Iowa medical license.

6. **CIVIL PENALTY:** Respondent shall pay a **\$5,000** civil penalty. The civil penalty shall be made payable to the Treasurer of Iowa, and mailed to the Executive Director of the Board prior to issuance of his Iowa medical license. The civil penalty shall be deposited into the State General Fund.

7. Applicant shall obey all federal, state and local laws, and all rules governing the practice of medicine in Iowa.

8. Applicant voluntarily submits this Consent Agreement to the Board for consideration.

9. By entering into this Consent Agreement, Applicant voluntarily waives any right to a contested case hearing in this matter.

10. This Consent Agreement is subject to approval of the Board. If the Board fails to approve the Order, it shall be of no force or effect to either party.


11. The Board's approval of this Consent Agreement shall constitute a **FINAL ORDER** of the Board.


