At 12:15 p.m., on a motion by Allison Schoenfelder, M.D., seconded by Julie Carmody, M.D., all members present voted to meet in closed session, pursuant to Iowa Code Sections 21.5(1)(c), 21.5(1)(d) and 21.5(1)(f), to discuss strategy with counsel in matters that are presently in litigation or where litigation is imminent, whether to initiate licensee

disciplinary proceedings and discuss the decision to be rendered in a contested case. Julie Carmody, M.D., Ronald Cheney, D.O., Julie Perkins, M.D., Allison Schoenfelder, M.D., Hamed Tewfik, M.D., and Michael Thompson, D.O., all voted aye in a roll call vote to approve the motion.

At 3:43 p.m., all members present voted in favor of a motion by Michael Thompson, D.O., seconded by Julie Carmody, M.D., to meet in an open session.

On December 10, 2014, the Iowa Board of Medicine issued a Notice to Cease and Desist to Amy D. Putney, Waterloo, Iowa, advising her that she must cease and desist from engaging in the practice of medicine in Iowa. The Board received information which indicates that Ms. Putney has performed electroencephalograms (EEGs) and quantitative electroencephalograms (QEEGs) and provided neurofeedback treatment to patients with attention deficit disorder (ADD), attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), learning disorders, sleep disorders, migraines and other health and mental health conditions in violation of the laws and rules governing the practice of medicine in Iowa. The information reviewed by the Board indicated that Ms. Putney has not graduated from an accredited medical school and does not hold an Iowa medical license. The Board recently received concerns regarding the content of the Notice to Cease and Desist issued to Ms. Putney. The Board voted to issue an **Amended Notice to Cease and Desist** informing Ms. Putney that the Board recognizes that the use of EEGs, QEEGs and neurofeedback may also be within the scope of other licensed health and mental health professions but the Board's investigation revealed that she does not hold appropriate licensure or certification to provide such services in Iowa.

Hamed Tewfik, M.D., chair, called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m. A roll call was taken to establish a presence of a quorum of the Board. The following items were addressed:

Opportunity for public comment

Tom Cope with Avenson, Oakley, and Cope presented information on behalf of Teledoc Inc. regarding the Board's proposed rule (**ARC 1769C**) on standards of practice for physicians who use telemedicine.

Mary LaMar with the Iowa Association of Nurse Anesthetists presented information to the Board opposing legislation (**SSB 1150 and HSB 103**) that would provide for licensure of anesthesiologist assistants under the Board of Medicine.

Robert Aiken asked the Board to nullify its February 7, 2002, policy statement on naturopathy. Mr. Aiken provided a document from the World Health Organization outlining the legal status of alternative and complementary. The document is available online.

Chair's report

Dr. Tewfik did not provide a report.

Executive Director's report

Mark Bowden provided the following updates:

- Amy Van Maanen has been named acting coordinator for the Iowa Physician Health Program, temporary filling a vacancy caused by a resignation in December 2014. Ms. Van Maanen is the project manager for IPHP. Mr. Bowden said the open position is under review and an update on staffing will be provided at the April meeting.
- Governor Branstad and Lt. Governor Reynolds will soon announce appointments to the Board, effective May 1. Frank Bognanno, Michael Thompson, D.O., and Julie Perkins, M.D., are not seeking reappointments when their terms expire April 30, 2014. Those pending open seats, as well as the seat vacated by Robert Bender, M.D. last year, will be filled by new appointments.
- The tentative agenda for the Federation of State Medical Boards' annual meeting, April 23-25, at Fort Worth, TX, has been provided to Board members. Dr. Tewfik will be the Board's voting delegate at the FSMB House of Delegates session on April 25.
- The Board is publishing a "consumer guide" for people who file complaints against licensees. The brochure, which will be mailed to complainants and is available on the Board's website, provides quick and easy information on how the Board receives and investigates complaints.
- Staff will meet on Friday, February 13, with Harbans Deol, D.O., medical director, Iowa Department of Corrections. The staff meets annually with Dr. Deol to discuss the nature of the complaints received from persons who are incarcerated in the state's correctional facilities..

Administrative rules

- **ARC 1769C** establishes the standards of practice for telemedicine. A public hearing was held at the Wallace State Office Building on January 15, 2015. The rule was noticed on October 3, 2014. The Board will consider adoption of the rule at the April meeting.
- The Board provided comment to the Iowa Board of Physician Assistants regarding **ARC 1741C**, which will reduce supervisory requirements for physicians who supervise physicians in remote clinics. Administrative Rules Review Committee will hold a public hearing on the rule on April 10.
- The new rule for Military Service and Veteran Reciprocity is effective January 28. The rule will come into play when a qualified veteran who holds a medical license in one state seeks licensure in Iowa. The new rule requires the Board to expedite the review of a veteran's application and to determine if the veteran's military training and experience can be applied toward requirements for licensure in Iowa. In addition, the new rule establishes licensure by reciprocity if the applicant is already licensed in a state whose licensure requirements are equivalent to Iowa's.

Potential legislation for 2015

Mr. Bowden provided a brief update on several bills that are or will be considered by the 86th

General Assembly, which convened January 12:

- The Board's legislation to update the law (Section 148E) on acupuncture is before a subcommittee of the House Human Resources Committee.
- The Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (**SF273**) has been introduced in the House and the Senate. It has been approved by a Senate Human Resources subcommittee. It has been introduced to 8 states and is expected to be introduced to 20 states this spring.
- The Board's two-prong legislation (**SF276**) that voids an inactive license after five years and allows the Board to issue an administrative license has been introduced in the Senate and has been assigned to a subcommittee.
- Separate legislation introduced by the Board would raise the civil penalty cap from \$10,000 to \$20,000 and would allow the Board to assign certain non-medical cases to be heard by an administrative law judge instead of a Board panel. These bills are stalled in a Senate Human Resources subcommittee.
- The Board's legislation requiring physicians to review the patient prescribing records in the prescription monitoring program database is stalled in a Senate Human Resources subcommittee. There is another bill that will be introduced that would require physicians who prescribe and dispense controlled substances out of their offices to provide that information to the PMP.
- The Board has already determined to support the licensure of anesthesiologist assistants, legislation being proposed by the Iowa Society of Anesthesiologists. The anesthesiologist assistants are licensed or registered in 17 states. They work under the direct supervision of an anesthesiologists. The legislation (**SSB 1150 and HSB 103**) has been introduced and there is a public hearing for this on Thursday, February 12.
- Legislation to license naturopaths has been introduced in the House and Senate. The legislation would require that naturopathic physicians be licensed by the Iowa Board of Medicine. The Board opposed similar legislation introduced in 2013. Mr. Bowden asked if the Board wanted to take a position on the new legislation. At 10:33 a.m. on a motion by Allison Schoenfelder, M.D., and a second by Hamed Tewfik, M.D., the Board voted to oppose new legislation on naturopathic licensure. Julie Carmody, M.D., Ronald Cheney, D.O., Julie Perkins, M.D., and Michael Thompson, D.O., Allison Schoenfelder, M.D., and Hamed Tewfik, M.D., all voted "aye" in favor of the motion.
- The Board of Nursing has introduced legislation updating chapter 152. This deals with the advanced registered nurse practitioners.
- Legislation was introduced that would allow physician assistants to make recommendations to the court regarding committals in mental emergency situations. The legislation would amend the current law that requires the physician assistant to consult with the supervising physician before making that recommendation to the court. Mr. Bowden asked if the Board wanted to take a position on the legislation. At 10:35 a.m. on a motion by Allison Schoenfelder, M.D., and a second by Hamed Tewfik, M.D., the

Board voted to oppose the legislation on physician assistants to make recommendations to the court regarding committals in mental emergency situations. Julie Carmody, M.D., Ronald Cheney, D.O., Julie Perkins, M.D., and Michael Thompson, D.O., Allison Schoenfelder, M.D., and Hamed Tewfik, M.D., all voted “aye” in favor of the motion.

- Legislation has been introduced that would allow psychologists to prescribe psychotropic medication. The Board opposed similar legislation introduced in 2013. Mr. Bowden asked if the Board wanted to take a position on the new legislation. At 10:36 a.m. on a motion by Allison Schoenfelder, M.D. and a second by Julie Carmody, M.D., the Board voted to oppose the legislation to allow psychologists to prescribe psychotropic medication. Ronald Cheney, D.O., Julie Perkins, M.D., Hamed Tewfik, M.D., Allison Schoenfelder, M.D., Julie Carmody, M.D., and Michael Thompson, D.O., all voted “aye” in favor of the motion.
- Polysomnographic techs are seeking licensure. Polysomnographic techs initially wanted to be licensed under the Iowa Board of Medicine but the new legislation does not have them with the Board of Medicine.
- Mr. Bowden noted that legislation is frequently introduced to establish standards of practice for physicians for specific procedures.. Five bills have been introduced on all aspects of abortion, for example. One bill requires that patients receive more detailed mammography reports and be able to discuss those with their primary care provider who has ordered the report.
- Several bills have been introduced on rule making. There is legislation that has been introduced this session that would require rules to sunset after 5 years. There is a proposed law that would require more aggressive public hearings on s rules. When the Board wrote the standards of practice for medical abortions it published a detailed explanation that examined the arguments for and against that rule. There is legislation requiring the Board and all regulatory Boards to produce those types of explanations on any and all rules.

Judicial review of Board cases and related cases

Jordan Esbrook, Assistant Iowa Attorney General, briefed the Board on five cases under judicial review in state courts:

IAC 653 13.10 – Standards of practice for physicians who perform medical abortions.

Supreme Court. The Board’s brief was submitted in mid-January. Planned Parenthood’s reply brief due week of February 1. Case has been set for oral argument for March 11.

Amjad Butt, M.D. – Two cases. District Court has reinstated one case previously dismissed because respondent’s attorney failed to timely file a brief. The court subsequently allowed this case to move forward for briefing. The other is on appeal in the Supreme Court. Board’s brief was filed in January.

Richard Fleming, M.D. – Dr. Fleming continues to submit briefing that was not compliant. We are awaiting a filing from him and then final briefs will be submitted. He is still submitting a non-compliant appendix. Awaiting court order.

Wendy Smoker, M.D. – Appeals Court. Dr. Smoker is seeking reimbursement for alcohol screening after Appeals Court overturned Board’s charges against her. Final briefs have been submitted. Awaiting schedule for oral argument.

Amy D. Putney – She is seeking a judicial review challenging the Board’s cease and desist order concerning her practice of neurofeedback.

Iowa Physician Health Program

Amy Van Maanen, projects managing and acting coordinator of the Iowa Physician Health Program (IPHP), presented an update on the program and the Iowa Physician Health Committee. At the last IPHC meeting, members began reviewing quarterly reports to revise them, look at treatment team providers that IPHC has and define their roles and expectations to make revisions to the quarterly reports.

Ms. Van Maanen will meet with the University of Iowa Hospital and Clinics’ substance chemical dependency services. She will reach out to the Board’s most used providers in Dubuque and Des Moines to get feedback on their interactions with the IPHC program.

She noted that a group of participants have started their own self-help “caduceus” group. The group has grown in numbers and is a great group of support for physicians that have substance use issues. Another group of physicians want to be available to talk to other physicians that are coming out of treatment. Also, a physician went through mindfulness training and is now working with her health system in trying to establish a series of seminars on mindfulness on the person she has been working with.

Licensure Committee

Chair Allison Schoenfelder, M.D., reported the committee voted to grant a waiver request on Iowa Administrative Code 653-9.15 subsection 2 and 11.4 subsection 4, which requires CME requirements for reinstatement, voted to grant a request for waiver Iowa Administrative Code 653-9.7 subsection 1E regarding the 10-year time limit on successfully passing the USMLE, left 3 applications open to obtain more information, asked 1 applicant to withdrawal, and granted 2 temporary licenses.

The Board discussed information it received concerning Diana Fern, who is providing medical services to women in Iowa, including the management of prenatal care, labor and delivery and postpartum care, without appropriate licensure or certification. The information received alleges that Ms. Fern provided prenatal care for a pregnant mother and assisted in the delivery of her

child on 02/25/2013. The Board has serious concerns that the mother was Rh negative and the newborn was Rh positive and Ms. Fern failed to ensure that the mother received Rh immunoglobulin in a timely manner placing future pregnancies at risk. The Board noted that Ms. Fern is not appropriately licensed or certified to provide such medical services in the state of Iowa and voted to send her a **Notice to Cease and Desist** advising her to Cease and Desist from providing such medical services in Iowa in the future without appropriate licensure or certification.
