

**PRESS RELEASE**  
**IOWA BOARD OF MEDICINE**  
**(December 23, 2010)**

Recently, the Iowa Board of Medicine took the following actions:

[Daniel K. Anderson, M.D.](#), a 48-year-old physician who formerly practiced medicine in Grinnell, Iowa, agreed not to practice medicine under his Iowa medical license. On July 19, 2006, Dr. Anderson entered into an Initial Agreement with the Iowa Physician Health Program (IPHP) and agreed to fully comply with the recommendations of the IPHP, including assessment, counseling and monitoring for mental health and substance abuse. On November 28, 2006, the IPHP offered Dr. Anderson a Physician Health Contract for continued mental health and substance abuse monitoring. Dr. Anderson declined to enter into the Physician Health Contract and he failed to comply with the IPHP recommendations. On September 13, 2007, the Board charged Dr. Anderson with violating his IPHP Initial Agreement. On November 8, 2007, Dr. Anderson entered into a Settlement Agreement with the Board to resolve the pending disciplinary charges. The Board placed Dr. Anderson on probation for a period of five years subject to substance abuse and mental health monitoring, issued him a public reprimand and ordered him to pay a \$2,500 fine. Dr. Anderson has moved out of the state of Iowa and does not intend to practice medicine under his Iowa medical license at this time. On December 16, 2010, Dr. Anderson entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board and agreed that he shall not practice medicine under his Iowa medical license until and unless he receives prior written approval from the Board. In the event that he returns to the practice of medicine in the future, Dr. Anderson is required to fully comply with the terms of the November 8, 2007, Settlement Agreement.

[Dennis D. Glawe, D.O.](#), a 61-year-old physician who formerly practiced medicine in Calmar, Iowa, voluntarily surrendered his Iowa medical license. On October 31, 1996, the Board charged Dr. Glawe with engaging in a sexual relationship with a female patient in early 1996. Dr. Glawe received a public reprimand and he was ordered to pay a \$2,000 fine for engaging in a sexual relationship with a patient. The Board received information which indicates that Dr. Glawe recently engaged in a sexual relationship with a female patient. On December 16, 2010, Dr. Glawe entered into a combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement with the Board and agreed to surrender his Iowa medical license to resolve this matter.

[James G. Kannenberg, M.D.](#), a 58-year-old physician who practiced family medicine in Fort Madison, Iowa, had his Iowa medical license reinstated by the Board. On December 23, 2009, the Board ordered Dr. Kannenberg to undergo a physical, neuropsychological, mental health and disruptive behavior evaluation. On April 8, 2010, Dr. Kannenberg voluntarily stopped practicing medicine to address the Board's concerns. On July 8, 2010, Dr. Kannenberg entered into a combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement with the Board. The Board charged Dr. Kannenberg with failure to pay appropriate attention to a stroke patient; failure to respond as the "physician-on-call" in the emergency department; failure to provide appropriate care to another patient who suffered a stroke; performing inadequate examinations and billing for services that were not provided; and failure to provide appropriate monitoring for patients who underwent cardiac stress tests. Dr. Kannenberg agreed to complete Board-approved counseling and a Board-approved ethics program. Dr. Kannenberg agreed not to return to the practice of medicine until he has received written approval from the Board. On December 16, 2010, the Board reinstated Dr. Kannenberg's Iowa medical license and placed him on probation for a period of five years subject to counseling and Board monitoring.

[Glenn C. Krug, D.O.](#), a 61-year-old physician who formerly practiced obstetrics and gynecology in Davenport, Iowa, voluntarily surrendered his Iowa medical license. On February 10, 2005, the Board charged Dr. Krug with failing to complete a Board-ordered physical, neuropsychological and substance abuse evaluation. Dr. Krug subsequently completed the evaluation. On June 2, 2005, Dr. Krug entered into a Settlement Agreement with the Board. He was placed on a Board monitoring program for a period of two years and he was issued a public reprimand for inappropriately prescribing controlled substances to family members and failing to maintain appropriate controlled substance records in his office. On November 8, 2007, the Board charged Dr. Krug with violating the terms of the Settlement Agreement. The Board placed Dr. Krug on probation for a period of five years, he was issued a public reprimand and he was ordered to pay a \$5,000 fine. On February 11, 2008, the Board charged Dr. Krug with engaging in a pattern of professional incompetency and practice harmful or detrimental to the public. On May 13, 2009, the Board placed Dr. Krug on indefinite probation and issued him a public reprimand. On July 15, 2009, Dr. Krug retired from the practice of medicine. On September 2, 2009, Dr. Krug entered into a Stipulated Order with the Board and he agreed not to practice medicine. On December 16, 2010, entered into a new Stipulation Order with the Board and he voluntarily surrendered his Iowa medical license. [Glenn C. [Angel S. Martin, M.D.](#), a 62-year-old physician who formerly practiced general surgery in Newton, Iowa, voluntarily surrendered his Iowa medical license. On November 8, 2007, the Board charged Dr. Martin with engaging in a pattern of professional incompetency and practice harmful or detrimental to the public. On August 6, 2009, Dr. Martin entered into a Settlement Agreement and the Board placed him on probation subject to board monitoring for a period of five years. Dr. Martin was also issued a public reprimand, ordered to pay a \$7,500 fine and ordered to maintain professional malpractice insurance. On January 14, 2010, Dr. Martin was convicted of 31 counts of health care fraud in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Iowa and on October 28, 2010, Dr. Martin was sentenced to six months in prison. On December 16, 2010, Dr. Martin entered into a combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement with the Board and he voluntarily surrendered his Iowa medical license.

[Andrew D. Smith, Jr., M.D.](#), a 58-year-old physician who practices general surgery in Iowa City, Iowa, entered into a combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement with the Board. Under the terms of the December 16, 2010, Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement, the Board charged Dr. Smith for performing a partial tubal ligation on a patient without obtaining appropriate patient consent. The Board issued Dr. Smith a public reprimand, he was ordered to pay a \$2,500 fine and he was required to submit a written corrective action plan describing the steps he has taken to avoid similar concerns in the future.
