

## **IOWA BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS PRESS RELEASE**

**For release, October 8, 1999**

At its regular meeting held in Des Moines on September 29, 1999, the Iowa Board of Medical Examiners filed charges against the following Iowa licensed physicians:

**Jefferey L. Allyn, M.D.**, a 41 year old physician practicing in Perry, Iowa, was charged with violating the terms and conditions of a Board Order. Dr. Allyn is charged with failing to comply with the terms of the Board's drug screening program in violation of a combined Statement of Charges, Settlement Agreement and Final Order entered into with the Board on July 15, 1999.

**Sardev S. Sidhu, M.D.**, a 47 year old physician from Casa Grande, Arizona, was charged by the Iowa Board with entering into a voluntary agreement with the medical licensing authority of Arizona which restricts Respondent's medical license. Dr. Sidhu was issued a Decree of Censure for unprofessional conduct, his Arizona medical license was placed on indefinite probation under certain terms and conditions and he is restricted from treating female patients. Dr. Sidhu has not practiced in Iowa for some time. A hearing on the charges is scheduled for January 19, 2000.

In other action, the Board entered into Settlement Agreements with the following Iowa licensed physicians:

**Ali S. Makki, M.D.**, a 40 year old physician from Dearborn, Michigan, entered into a Settlement Agreement and Final Order with the Iowa Board. Dr. Makki was charged with having been disciplined by the medical licensing authority for the state of Michigan. The Michigan Board charged Dr. Makki with mail fraud and his Michigan license was placed on probation for one year. The Probation has expired and his Michigan license is unrestricted. The Iowa Board issued a Citation and Warning and Dr. Makki was ordered to pay a \$1,000 civil penalty.
