

## **IOWA BOARD OF MEDICAL EXAMINERS AMENDED PRESS RELEASE**

Recently, the Iowa Board of Medical Examiners took the following action:

**Thomas F. Babcock, D.O.**, a 55 year-old physician, formerly practicing in Jefferson, Iowa, entered into a Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement with the Board to resolve a pending disciplinary investigation. Dr. Babcock was charged with engaging in sexual misconduct in the practice of medicine. Dr. Babcock underwent extensive professional sexual misconduct treatment at a nationally recognized program. Under the terms of the Settlement Agreement, Dr. Babcock's Iowa medical license was placed on probation for a period of five years subject to certain monitoring conditions. Additionally, Dr. Babcock is required to have a chaperone present while treating all female patients and he was issued a Citation and Warning and ordered to pay a \$5,000 fine.

**Joseph L. Monahan, III, D.O.**, a 46 year-old physician from Vinton, Iowa, had a disciplinary decision issued by the Board following a May 15, 2003, hearing. The Board previously charged Dr. Monahan on September 12, 1989, for inappropriate drug use and his license was placed on probation for five years. Dr. Monahan successfully completed the terms of his probation. The Board recently received evidence Dr. Monahan again engaged in the inappropriate use of drugs and charges were filed on April 3, 2003. Under the terms of the recent decision, Dr. Monahan's Iowa medical license was placed on indefinite probation subject to certain terms and conditions due to inappropriate drug use.

**Neil B. Sloan, M.D.**, a 54 year-old physician from Mason City, Iowa, was denied a permanent Iowa medical license. The Board determined that Dr. Sloan provided false information on his application for an Iowa medical license and that he provided false information to the Board when questioned about the license application. The Board also received information indicating Dr. Sloan was denied a medical license by the California Medical Board.

**Frederick H. Stansbury, D.O.**, a 47 year-old physician formerly practicing in Des Moines, Iowa, entered into a Settlement Agreement with the Board to resolve pending disciplinary charges. Dr. Stansbury was charged with professional incompetency and engaging in sexual misconduct in the practice of medicine. Under the terms of the Settlement Agreement, Dr. Stansbury agreed not to practice medicine under his Iowa medical license. Prior to practicing medicine under his Iowa license, Dr. Stansbury must complete a comprehensive competency evaluation at a Board-approved program and professional sexual misconduct evaluation and treatment at a nationally recognized treatment program. Dr. Stansbury was also issued a Citation and Warning and ordered to pay a \$1,000 fine.

**Mark R. Young, M.D.** a 45 year-old physician from Indianola, Iowa, was charged by the Board with habitual intoxication or addiction to the use of drugs and the inability to practice medicine and surgery in a safe manner due to the excessive use of drugs. Dr. Young was referred to the Board for discipline after failing to comply with terms and conditions established by the Board's Iowa Physician Health Program, when Dr. Young tested positive for controlled drugs on two separate occasions. A hearing in this matter is scheduled for August 26, 2003.
