Board Minutes – October 26-27, 2017

On a motion by KellyAnn Light McGroary, M.D., seconded by Nicole Gilg Gachiani, M.D., the Board approved the October 26-27, 2017, open minutes as presented.

On a motion by Nicole Gilg Gachiani, M.D., seconded by Warren Gall, M.D., the Board approved the October 26-27, 2017, closed minutes as presented.

Chair's Report

Kyle Ulveling, M.D., chair, said he had nothing to report other than to wish happy holidays to everyone.

Executive Director's Report

Mr. Bowden offered these updates:

- Board Investigator Cathy McCullough will retire at the end of December. She has worked for the Board for 22 years.
- Through the end of October, the Board has reviewed 700 investigative cases this year, filed charges against 16 physicians, and issued 69 confidential compliance letters to Iowa-licensed physicians and 19 confidential compliance letters to physicians seeking licensure in Iowa.
- The Bureau of Health Statistics has launched a mobile app for physicians to complete death certifications in the Electronic Death Registration System.

- Warren Gall, M.D., will attend a training activity at the Center for Professional Education for Physicians on February 26-27, 2018, in Denver CO. Other training activities are available for Board members, including the annual meeting of the Federation of State Medical Boards April 26-28, 2018, in Raleigh, NC.

Administrative Rules

ARC 3360C: Standards of practice — experimental treatments for patients with a terminal illness, 653 IAC 13.13. These amendments implement 2017 Iowa Acts, Senate File 404. A public hearing was held on October 31, 2017. No comments received. The Administrative Rules Review Committee reviewed the amendments on November 14, 2017.

On a motion by the Executive Committee, seconded by Nicole Gilg Gachiani, M.D., the Board voted to adopt the amendments to ARC 3360C. The amendments are scheduled to become effective February 21, 2018.

ARC 3361C: Standards of practice — tick-borne disease diagnosis and treatment, 653 IAC 13.14. These amendments implement 2017 Iowa Acts, HF 577. A public hearing was held on October 31, 2017. No comments received. The Administrative Rules Review Committee reviewed the amendments on November 14, 2017.

On a motion by the Executive Committee, seconded by Charles Wadle, D.O., the Board voted to adopt the amendments to ARC 3361C. The amendments are scheduled to become effective February 21, 2018.

ARC 3368C: Permanent and administrative medicine physician licensure, amendments to Chapter 9. A public hearing was held on October 31, 2017. Comments were submitted by the Iowa Osteopathic Medical Association (IOMA). The Administrative Rules Review Committee reviewed the amendments on November 14, 2017.

Kent Nebel, Director of Legal Affairs, revised the proposed rule making to take into account IOMA's proposal to clarify the definition of "medical observer."

On a motion by Kyle Ulveling, M.D., seconded by Ronald Kolegraff, M.D., the Board voted to adopt ARC 3368C, including the revisions presented by Mr. Nebel. The rule making is scheduled to become effective February 21, 2018.

Charles Wadle, D.O., chair of the Board of Medicine's subcommittee working with a similar subcommittee from the Board of Psychology, provided an update on the subcommittees' work to draft joint rules to implement 2016 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2188. This legislation authorizes certain psychologists to prescribe psychotropic medicines. He spoke about a recent meeting of the Board of Medicine's subcommittee and its focus on identifying the classwork, curriculum, associated hours, etc., for a graduate-level psychopharmacology academic degree required for qualified psychologists who would prescribe psychotropic medicines. He said his subcommittee will continue its work on this outline

before sharing it with the Board of Psychology subcommittee. The goal is to find consensus on program requirements so that the joint rule can be presented to both boards. If acceptable by both boards, the rule making could be initiated in early 2018.

ARC 3264C – A report on training and communications concerning the supervisory agreements required for physicians who supervise physician assistants was given by Mr. Bowden. He reported that weekly training started October 2 and will continue through the end of 2017. There have been more than 400 participants to date. Information on the new rules was sent by postal mail and e-mail to physicians, physician assistants and other stakeholders on November 20 and will be sent again on December 20. The Board will begin enforcing the new rules on January 1, 2018.

Kent Nebel, Director of Legal Affairs added that in there is a lot of confusion and misunderstanding among the community of what the long standing requirements have been, that this training is bringing it to their attention and that it is modifying practices within the State of Iowa.

He said that the Executive Committee discussed the rule and recommend the Board reach out to the Iowa Board of Physician Assistants to discuss potential amendments to the remote medical site rule.

Kyle Ulveling, M.D., explained that the definition of a remote medical site and the twice-monthly visitation requirements of a supervising physician are rules established by the Board of Physician Assistants. Mr. Nebel noted that due to recent legislation, these rules cannot be amended without approval by both boards.

Mr. Nebel referenced the two requests the Board of Medicine has received for Waiver of Variance of remote medical site requirements. He recommended the Board table these requests while the Board seeks a dialogue with the Board of Physician Assistants regarding the remote site rules. He recommended the Board advise the individuals requesting the Waivers that the Waivers require further review in cooperation with the Iowa Board of Physician Assistants before the Board can make a decision.

On a motion by Kyle Ulveling, M.D., and a second by Ronald Kolegraff, M.D., the Board voted to accept Mr. Nebel's recommendations.

ARC 3455C – Mr. Nebel provided an update on the Board of Physician Assistants' initiated a rule, **ARC 3455C**, which implements 2017 Iowa Acts, House File 591. This legislation instructs the Board of Physician Assistants to establish specific procedures in rules for the consulting with and sharing information with the Board of Medicine about complaints that may involve inadequate supervision by a physician. The public hearing on this rulemaking was held December 12, 2017.

2018 Legislation

Nicole Gilg Gachiani, M.D., chair of a Board ad hoc committee appointed by Dr. Ulveling, met via teleconference to discuss and formulate recommendations for the Board to offer legislative priorities related to the opioid crisis. She reviewed the committee's recommendations, which covered three categories: the prescription drug monitoring program (PMP), clinical guidelines for prescribing controlled substances, and education for physicians who prescribe controlled substances. She reported that the committee had a good discussion and a better understanding of legislation being considered or pursued by

other stakeholders. The discussion included requiring Iowa physicians to be registered with the PMP and possibly amending the Board's administrative rule requiring primary care physicians to complete training on chronic pain management and end-of-life care. She said the discussion included possibly amending the rule to mandate that all Iowa physicians who have an Iowa Controlled Substance Registration be required to complete the chronic pain and end-of-life training. Dr. Gilg Gachiani said the committee discussed and agreed that they would like to see more providers and clinics, such as methadone clinics, where prescribing controlled substances, report these prescriptions to the PMP.

Lori Peter from I Hate Heroin spoke about the death of her son caused by a heroin overdose. She said his addiction to heroine began with the use of prescribed opioids and how she supports a prescriber's use of the PMP. She expressed her gratitude to the Board for "getting it" and how her employment as a nurse gives her a special insight on the opioid epidemic and the importance of doctors being held accountable by being required to use PMP.

Diane Heiken from I Hate Heroin spoke. She works primarily in children's mental health at the University of Iowa and has been a retail pharmacist for 23 years. She said that she volunteers for I Hate Heroine and serves on the Opioids Response Teen Interview, a collaborative team of mental health professionals, law enforcement, health care providers and legislators. She ask that the Board to support I Hate Heroin's legislative objectives.

Dennis Tibben from the Iowa Medical Society (IMS) spoke on behalf of the society's opposition to some of the proposals put forth by the Board's committee. He said IMS has done a lot of work in recent years regarding opioid use, working very closely with the Iowa Harm Reduction Coalition. He said IMS views the prescribing community to be taking this issue seriously, and through the society's voluntary methods, progress is being made. He said IMS's legislative agenda recommends that all prescribers would be registered with the PMP at the time of renewal of their Controlled Substance Act Registration through the Board of Pharmacy.

Andrew Funk, Executive Director of the Board of Pharmacy, spoke about his board's legislative agenda, including providing more timely pharmacy reports to the PMP, adding a surcharge to the Controlled Substance Act Registration to create an educational fund for the PMP, establishing a new advisory committee for the PMP, requiring electronic prescriptions for all prescriptions, effective January 1, 2019, and requiring all prescribers who directly furnish controlled substances to patients to report these prescriptions to the PMP. He also spoke about the integration of the other states in the program and the opportunity to interconnect with those states to receive reporting information from them.

Kyle Ulveling, M.D., advised the I Hate Heroine representatives that the Board will continue its discussion on the ad hoc committee's recommendations at a teleconference meeting on January 11, 2018.

Interstate Medical Licensure Compact

Mary Jo Romanco and Mr. Bowden, Iowa's commissioners on the Interstate Medical Licensure Commission, attended the Commission's annual meeting November 17, 2017, in Phoenix, AZ. Ms. Romanco announced the election of Mr. Bowden as the chairman of the commission. Mr. Bowden recognized the compact work performed by the Board's licensure staff members Natalie Sipes and Sylvia Crook. Kyle Ulveling, M.D., concurred and thanked the staff for their efforts.

Iowa Physician Health Program

Amy VanMaanen, coordinator of the Iowa Physician Health Program, presented the program's monthly statistics and spoke briefly about the November meeting. She asked the Board to appoint Jeanine Freeman, Des Moines, to a second three-year term on the Iowa Physician Health Committee. She will complete her first term at the end of 2017 and is eligible for appointment for a second term.

On a motion from Ronald Kolegraff, M.D., seconded by Mary Jo Romano, the Board voted to appoint Ms. Freeman to a second three-year term on the Iowa Physician Health Committee, effective January 1, 2018.

Judicial Review

Julie Bussanmas, Assistant Attorney General and counsel for the Board, provided updates on these cases under judicial review:

In the case of Rabi v. Board of Medicine – The Iowa Supreme Court has denied any further review of the case involving Firas Rabi, M.D., who formerly practiced pediatric medicine in Iowa City. He had appealed the Court of Appeals opinion on September 17, 2017, which affirmed the Board's discipline of him on February 19, 2015 for engaging in a pattern of sexual harassment and unprofessional conduct.

In the case of Fleming v. State of Iowa – The lawsuit filed by Richard M. Fleming, M.D., with the U.S. Supreme Court alleging his constitutional rights were violated when the Board disciplined him in 2012 for his conviction of health care fraud and mail fraud has been dismissed.

Board education

Ms. Bussanmas reviewed **ARC 3408C** a rule making put forth by the Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals' Administrative Hearing Division. She advised that portions of the code concerning judicial conduct apply to Board members when they preside at contested case hearings.

Federation of State Medical Boards

Mr. Bowden provided several brief updates:

- The FSMB Board of Directors met October 25-27, 2017, in Dallas, TX, and a summary of that meeting was distributed to Board members.
- Nominations for FSMB awards are due December 29, 2017, and will be presented at the annual meeting in April, 2018.
- Applications for service on FSMB committees are due December 29, 2017. Appointments will be made by the new FSMB board chair in April 2018. Kyle Ulveling, M.D., and Warren Gall, M.D., have expressed interest in serving on a FSMB committee.
- A change in the FSMB bylaws has been proposed to allow state board executive directors a greater role on the FSMB Board of Directors.
- FSMB President Humayun Chaudhry recently testified before the U.S. House Committee on Veterans Affairs Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations, on the issue of "Examining VA's

Failure to Address Provider Quality and Safety Concerns.” Members of the committee called for the hearing after a new Government Accountability Office found that in an audit of five VA medical facilities, eight of nine providers who had adverse privileging actions were never reported to the NPDB or state medical boards.
