Recently, the Iowa Board of Medicine took the following action:

[Kolleen Burnett-Barnhardt, D.O.](#), a 45-year-old Iowa-licensed physician who practices pediatrics in Ft. Madison, Iowa, entered into a combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement with the Board on October 26, 2018. The Board alleged that Dr. Burnett-Barnhardt prescribed controlled substances to members of her immediate family on multiple occasions between November 2014 and August 2017 in violation of the laws and rules governing the practice of medicine in Iowa. Under the terms of the October 26, 2018, combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement, the Board issued Dr. Burnett-Barnhardt a Citation and Warning and ordered her to pay a \$2,500 civil penalty.

[Matthew A. Flemming, M.D.](#), a 55-year-old Iowa-licensed family physician who formerly practiced cardiovascular medicine in Mason City, Iowa, entered into a Stipulated Order - Voluntary Surrender with the Board on October 26, 2018. The Board learned that Dr. Flemming suffers from a health condition which impairs his ability to practice medicine. Under the terms of the October 26, 2018, Stipulated Order – Voluntary Surrender, Dr. Flemming voluntarily surrendered his Iowa medical license due to a health condition.

[Sara L. Glassgow, D.O.](#), a 44-year-old Iowa-licensed physician who formerly practiced general surgery in Silvis, Illinois, and currently practices in Kewanee, Illinois, entered into a combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement with the Iowa Board on October 26, 2018. On January 24, 2018, Dr. Glassgow entered into a Consent Order with the Illinois Division of Professional Regulation (Illinois Board). The Illinois Board alleged that Dr. Glassgow failed to provide appropriate surgical care to three patients in Illinois when she: nicked a patient's artery during an exploratory laparotomy; failed to treat a pneumothorax in a timely manner; and injured the hepatic duct during a laparoscopic cholecystectomy. The Illinois Board issued Dr. Glassgow a Reprimand and ordered her to pay a \$1,000 fine. Dr. Glassgow subsequently completed an additional year of surgical training and mentored with a surgeon in Illinois. Dr. Glassgow has fully complied with the terms of the Illinois Consent Order. Under the terms of the October 26, 2018, combined Statement of Charges and Settlement Agreement, the Iowa Board issued Dr. Glassgow a Citation and Warning.

[Samuel Kyung Uk Park, M.D.](#), a 61-year-old physician who practices family medicine entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board and was granted a permanent Iowa medical license on October 26, 2018. On May 10, 2013, the Medical Board of California (California Board) issued a disciplinary Decision against Dr. Park. The California Board determined that Dr. Park engaged in acts of gross negligence when he: allowed others to prescribe, or caused to be prescribed, the dangerous drugs Tretinoin Cream and Latisse over the phone and without conducting prior exams; dispensed or furnished, or caused to be dispensed or furnished, the dangerous drugs Tretinoin Cream and Latisse on the internet and telephone for deliveries to persons without prescriptions; allowed unlicensed persons to provide medical advice to patients regarding side effects and manner of use or application of the dangerous drugs Tretinoin Cream and/or Latisse; failed to maintain adequate and accurate records relating to the provisions of services; and failed to assess the ongoing efficacy and side effects of the dangerous drugs, Tretinoin Cream and/or Latisse. The California Board issued Dr. Park a public letter of reprimand. Under the terms of the October 26, 2018, Consent Agreement, the Iowa Board granted Dr. Park a permanent Iowa medical license and issued him a Citation and Warning for being disciplined by the California Board for engaging in gross negligence.

[Thomas M. Sprague, D.O.](#), a 67-year-old physician who practices psychiatry entered into a Consent Agreement with the Board and was granted a permanent Iowa medical license on October 26, 2018. On April 11, 2011, Dr. Sprague entered into an Agreed Licensure Order with the Texas Medical Board (Texas Board) and he was issued a Texas medical license. The Texas Board determined that Dr. Sprague submitted a false or misleading statement when applying for a Texas medical license and imposed a \$2,000 administrative penalty. On June 23, 2017, the Commonwealth of Kentucky Board of Medical Licensure (Kentucky Board) took public disciplinary action against Dr. Sprague in response to the Texas disciplinary action. Dr. Sprague failed to disclose the Kentucky disciplinary action on his application for a permanent Iowa medical license. Under the terms of the October 26, 2018, Consent Agreement, the Iowa Board granted Dr. Sprague a permanent Iowa medical license and issued him a Citation and Warning for being disciplined in Texas and Kentucky and for failing to disclose the Kentucky disciplinary action on his application for a permanent Iowa medical license.

When appropriate, disciplinary actions are reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank, an electronic repository administered by the U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration to track adverse license actions.
